Salvation will take you ...

III: Into the _____ of God: Heb. 10:24-25

Besides a saved person wanting to share their salvation with others, another indication that they are saved is they want to go to church. And so by way of our salvation, God moves our heart to come to His house.

A. there should be a desire to _____
with other saints

Heb. 3:12-13 ...¹² ***Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God.*** ¹³ ***But exhort one another daily, while it is called To day; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin.***

B. there should be a desire to _____ God
1 Cor. 10:31 ... ***Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.***

The Bible teaches us that we are *saved by grace, not of works, lest any man should boast* (Eph. 2:8-9)

If a person claims to be saved yet their salvation doesn't at least try (no conviction) to take them to live a holy / godly life; or to tell others about Jesus; or to come to church then it is possible that their "salvation" might not be taking them to Heaven ... because salvation moves us towards God in all areas of life, not just heaven.

Be sure you are trusting Jesus and His work alone for salvation.

All My Salvation

2 Sam. 23:5

Our text this morning provides insight to a moment in David's life when, in spite of his failures, he recognized that God's covenant with him would never change. And he references what's known as the Davidic Covenant, which has nothing to do with his eternal spiritual salvation, with the phrase "*all my salvation*".

As Christians, when we think of salvation, our mind typically moves exclusively to going to heaven when we die. And so the question becomes ... if David isn't attributing *all his salvation* to his eternal spiritual salvation, yet we as Christians almost exclusively attribute *all our salvation* to eternal life and heaven ... is there something about salvation ... that we, as Christians are not considering?

This morning, let's examine some very basic truths about where salvation takes us ... besides heaven.

All My Salvation

In addition to Heaven, salvation will take us ...

I: Into the _____: Turn to John 4:35

When a person gets saved, there is generally a desire for them to tell others about their salvation experience. This is because God has moved that person from one in need of being harvested to one who is now involved in the harvesting of lost souls. By way of their salvation God moves them...

A. from being lost to being a _____

Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest.

By way of one's salvation, a saved person looks at others (the harvest) with a desire to share the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with them.

B. from being lost to being a _____

Turn to Matthew 9:36-38

1 Cor. 3:9a ... ***For we are labourers together with God ...***

With salvation, everyone Believer has been called to the ministry of reconciliation. We are to labour with Jesus in order to expand and grow His kingdom.

Not only does your salvation take you to heaven, but it also takes you into the harvest. Don't let the harvest go to waist! Don't let it rot! Labour with Jesus to bring it into the Kingdom of God.

In addition to Heaven and the harvest, salvation will take us...

II: Into _____: Turn to 2 Corinthians 7:1

The area of personal holiness is often neglected in the lives of Christians. Yet God tells us ... ***Be ye holy, for I am holy.*** As hard as a lost person might try, this is impossible without salvation because with salvation comes a new way of thinking (God's way), and a new of living (God's way).

God's place of holiness is ...

A. a _____ place

... let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit,

Positionally, by way of our salvation, the Believer is in Christ , and that will never change. But as we live our life, and daily fail and fall into sin. then we are progressively brought back to that place of sanctification—separation unto God's purity and consecration—by confessing our sin to the Lord and asking His forgiveness, at which point He promises forgiveness pf our sin and to cleanse us from ALL unrighteousness (1 John 1:9).

B. a _____ place

... perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

With salvation comes God's completed process of holiness (separation unto God).

How blessed we are that our salvation not only takes us to Heaven and the harvest, but also to God's holiness!
