This morning we wrap up our Back to the Basics series on the Gospel of Christ. We've seen in part 1, the Identity of the Gospel - it belongs to the Biblical Jesus Christ; in part 2 we looked at the death of Jesus; part 3 revealed the importance of understanding the burial of Jesus; and this morning we conclude with the crown jewel of the Gospel - the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Now most of the time we typically hear resurrection-specific messages on Resurrection Sunday and the message usually focuses on the event of Jesus' resurrection. But this morning, we are going to examine what the Bible says and teaches about the resurrection of Jesus beyond the event and how it applies to us.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ
II: Christ as the Messiah
Sadly, many people reject the Bible and what it says about Jesus' resurrection. And so the question is— is there evidence outside of the Bible which reveals the truth of Jesus' resurrection and the truth that He is the Messiah?

• Flavius:"And those who had be-
come his disciples did not abandon his discipleship. They re- ported that he had appeared to them three days after his cru-
cifixion and that he was alive. Accordingly, he was perhaps the

ders."
• Cornelius: " The founder of this name, Christ [Christus in Latin], had been executed in the reign of Tiberius by the procurator Pontius Pilate Suppressed for a time, the deadly superstition erupted again not only in Judea, the origin of this evil, but also in the city [Rome], where all things horrible and shameful from everywhere come together and become popular."
